



CANTEEN OPERATIONS

Help out in the canteen by serving customers and preparing some food items for sale at all home games

Responsibilities

- Serve food and beverages at home games in a clean and safe manner
- Process orders using square receipt system (super easy to use)



EMERGENCY RESPONSE COORDINATOR

The AFL requires one ERC (minimum competency) trained volunteer to be present at all AFL events.

An ERC trained volunteer is someone that has completed the Emergency Response Coordinator (ERC) Course or holds a minimum First Aid Certificate.

The ERC will have the necessary skills required for emergency assessment, planning, on-field injury management and response priorities.

Responsibilities

- Emergency response priorities / on-field assessment of injured participants
- Concussion Management
- On-field communication
- Calling ambulance
- Completing any necessary incident report paperwork



GOAL UMPIRE

Umpire matches in accordance with the Laws of the Game.

Responsibilities

- Determine whether a goal or behind has been scored
- Signal that a goal or behind has been scored after being given the all clear by a field umpire
- Record all goals and behinds scored by each team during a match
- At the end of each quarter and at the end of each match, both goal umpires shall compare the score they have recorded.



GROUND MANAGER

Desirable Characteristics

- Good communication skills
- Have a sound understanding of the competition By-laws and Regulations

Duties & Responsibilities

- Set up and pack down all equipment and fields for the game (if not already done)
- Ensure the ground and surrounding areas are safe for the day/match activities (if not already done)
- Collect all relevant match day paperwork at the start and end of games
- Be the first point of contact for matchday issues
- Be clearly identifiable at all times during the day (wear clearly identifiable bib or shirt)



RUNNER

The role of the Runner is to assist coach on match day by delivering messages to players during the match.

Duties & Responsibilities

- Deliver messages from the coach to players whilst each quarter is in progress.
- Deliver the message as quickly as possible and return to the coach's box immediately.
- The runner must not loiter on the ground.
- The runner must not interfere with any players or officials throughout the game
- The runner must be correctly attired in accordance with league requirements – (we will provide you with a shirt or bib to wear as identification)



SCOREBOARD OPERATOR

- Ensure each point is allocated to the correct team during home games
- Watch the game carefully and ensure points are allocated as per the umpires instructions, including ground umpire and goal umpire
- Be familiar with the points scoring system for AFL games



TIMEKEEPER

The Timekeeper is to act as the official keeper of time for the duration of the match.

Duties & Responsibilities

- Keep time for each quarter of the match
- Sound the siren in accordance with the league rules and regulations (these are clearly displayed in the timekeepers room for reference during each game)



WATER CARRIER

The role of the Water Carrier is to assist the coach and team manager on match day by delivering water to players during the match.

- Deliver water to players whilst each quarter is in progress
- Refill water bottles as required
- The water carrier must not loiter on the ground
- The water carrier must not interfere with any players or officials throughout the game
- The water carrier must be correctly attired in accordance with league requirements (we will provide you with a shirt or bib to wear as identification)
